

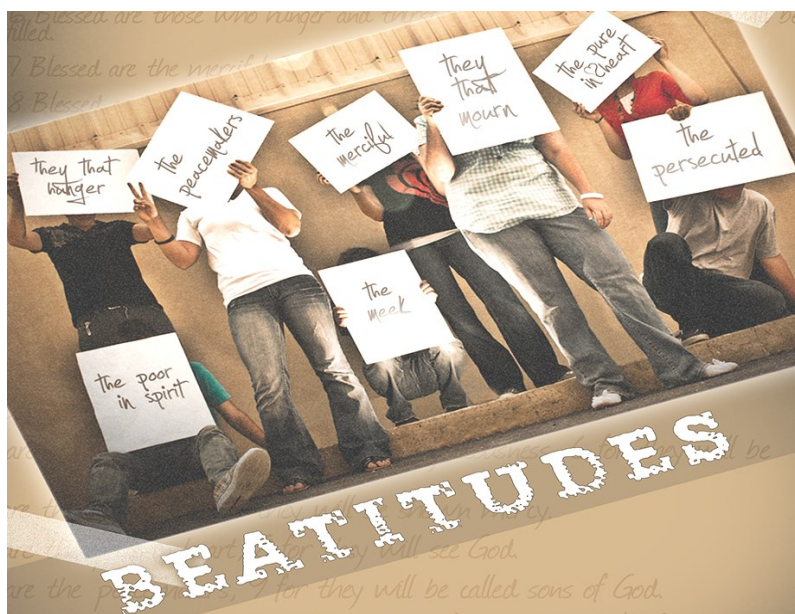

ABM Reflection

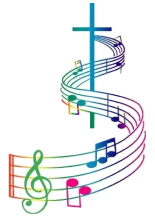

Worship Music Notes for Sunday 27th January
Organist 7:00am Joy Mann and 9:00am Ros Kay



Born in Leipzig, Tobial Clausnitzer (1619-1684) became a chaplain in the Swedish army, and later a pastor in Weiden, Saxony at the end of the bitter Thirty Years War in 1648. His hymn, **“Blessed Jesus, at your word”** (TIS 437) is often sung by the Christian community as a prayer for illumination when meditating on the Word of God.

Fred Pratt Green (1903-2000) was a British Methodist minister and prolific hymnwriter. He had a great concern for social issues and in writing hymns relevant to the contemporary church. When there was a need for a modern hymn on healing, he wrote **“O Christ the healer we have come”** (TIS638) under the heading, “A prayer for wholeness.”

Contemporary British hymn writer, Graham Kendrick (b. 1950) wrote **“Beauty for brokenness”** (TIS 690) in 1993 for the 25th anniversary of the charity, Tearfund. The hymn was inspired by a visit Kendrick had made to India in 1992, and his perception of the contrast between Indian poverty and Western affluence. He writes: “ I composed this with a concern in mind that the theme of God’s heart for his suffering world should be more prominent in regular worship.”

John Brownlow Geyer (b. 1932) is an English theologian. He writes: **“We know that Christ is raised”** was written in 1967, when I was tutor at Cambridge. It attempts to illustrate the Christian doctrines of Baptism and the Resurrection.” “It is a celebratory declaration of the Resurrection of Christ!”

Prior to his retirement, prolific hymn writer Brian Wren (b.1936) served as a professor of worship at Columbia Theological Seminary. His hymn, **“When love is found”** (TIS 654) was written for two weddings, that of his brother, the other, a good friend. However Wren also intended the hymn for congregational use as well. He set his text to the English folk tune, “O Waly, Waly.”

Journalist and author Luke Connaughton (1917-1979) wrote the hymn, **“The Voice Of God Goes Out To All The World”** which draws on themes from Isaiah 42 and 51. A feature of the hymn is the use of the same final line for each verse, “With power, with justice, he will walk his way.”

FIRST READING

Jeremiah 17: 5 - 10

A reading from the prophet Jeremiah

Thus says the LORD: Cursed are those who trust in mere mortals and make mere flesh their strength, whose hearts turn away from the LORD. They shall be like a shrub in the desert, and shall not see when relief comes. They shall live in the parched places of the wilderness, in an uninhabited salt land. Blessed are those who trust in the LORD, whose trust is the LORD. They shall be like a tree planted by water, sending out its roots by the stream. It shall not fear when heat comes, and its leaves shall stay green; in the year of drought it is not anxious, and it does not cease to bear fruit. The heart is devious above all else; it is perverse — who can understand it? I the LORD test the mind and search the heart, to give to all according to their ways, according to the fruit of their doings.

PSALM: 1

The Response to the Psalm is: **We delight in the care of the Lord.**

1. Blessed are they
who have not walked in the counsel of the ungodly:
nor followed the way of sinners,
nor taken their seat amongst the scornful. *Response*
2. But their delight is in the law of the Lord:
and on that law will they ponder day and night
3. They are like trees planted beside streams of water:

SECOND READING

1 Corinthians 15: 12 - 20

A reading from the first letter of Paul to the Corinthians

Now if Christ is proclaimed as raised from the dead, how can some of you say there is no resurrection of the dead? If there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ has not been raised; and if Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation has been in vain and your faith has been in vain. We are even found to be misrepresenting God, because we testified of God that he raised Christ—whom he did not raise if it is true that the dead are not raised. For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised. If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. Then those also who have died in Christ have perished. If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied. But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died.

"But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation. "Woe to you who are full now, for you will be hungry. "Woe to you who are laughing now, for you will mourn and weep. "Woe to you when all speak well of you, for that is what their ancestors did to the false prophets.

Have mercy on those on our parish prayer list and others we bring to mind (*reflection*).

Lord of eternal life, we thank you for the many mentors, exemplars and friends you send us in our pilgrimage (*reflection*). THE GREAT THANKSGIVING

Communicant members of other Christian traditions are always welcome to receive communion. If you have not been admitted to Holy Communion, you are invited to come forward to receive a blessing. Children who receive a blessing are also given a sticker. If you do not want to receive the sacrament, you are free to remain in your seat.

At 9:00am during Communion Cardinale will sing the Anthem: The Communion Motet was written by the French composer, César Franck (1822-1890,) and incorporated as a movement into his "Mass for Three Voices" in 1871. The Latin text used by Franck for the motet is a verse of one of the Eucharistic hymns written by St Thomas Aquinas (c.1225-1275) for the feast day of Corpus Christi (the Body of Christ.)

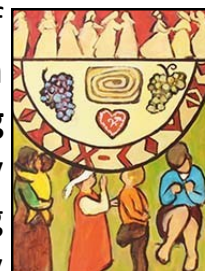
