MUSIC NOTES

Following his service as a lieutenant in World War I, John R. Peacey (1896-1971) was ordained as a priest and served in Churches and Colleges in both England and India. After his retirement, he wrote **“Filled with the Spirit's Power”** (TIS 411). He stated that he wished to write a hymn that focused on the work of the Spirit in the community of saints. The text draws on images from the Book of Acts, and is a prayer for unity and love in the Spirit. It is sung to the inspiring tune, “Woodlands,” by English musician and composer Walter Greatorex (1877-1949).

The hymn, **“A new commandment”** (TIS 699) has been widely published and sung for many years. Composer Roy Crabtree set to music the words of Jesus to his disciples, as recorded in John 13:34-35 - “A new commandment I give unto you, that ye love one another...by this, all will know that you are my disciples.”

“Love Divine” (TIS 217) was written by Charles Wesley (1707-1788), the great English hymn writer of the 18th century. He was devoted to expressing Christian Spirituality through hymns, and many of his poetic texts were completed whilst riding on horseback to his evangelical meetings. It has been said that “what really set him apart from other hymn writers was his effective use of scriptural allusions, providing a spiritual roadmap whereby individuals could imagine a Christ-centred life.” The last verse of the hymn, based on 2 Corinthians 3:18 describes our final restoration and transformation in Christ. First published in a collection entitled “Hymns for those that seek,” “Love Divine” has become one of Wesley’s best-known hymns.

The hymn **“O Jesus I Have Promised”** (TIS 595) was originally published under the title “Hymn for the newly Confirmed.” It was written by John Ernest Bode (1816-1874), Rector of Oxfordshire on the occasion of the confirmation of his three children in 1866. He told his children: “I have written a hymn containing all the important truths I want you to remember when you are fully confirmed.” The hymn is based on John’s gospel, 12:26, “Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also.” Originally titled "O Jesus, We Have Promised" for the three children being confirmed, the hymn was later changed to "O Jesus, I have promised," - a hymn of commitment. Of musical interest is the fact that it has been set and sung to many tunes - one source lists 18 different tunes!

SECOND READING: 1 John 5:1-12

Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ has been born of God, and everyone who loves the parent loves the child. By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God and obey his commandments. For the love of God is this, that we obey his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome, for whatever is born of God conquers the world. And this is the victory that conquers the world, our faith. Who is it that conquers the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God? This is the one who came by water and blood, Jesus Christ, not with the water only but with the water and the blood. And the Spirit is the one that testifies, for the Spirit is the truth. There are three that testify: the Spirit and the water and the blood, and these three agree. If we receive human testimony, the testimony of God is greater; for this is the testimony of God that he has testified to his Son. Those who believe in the Son of God have the testimony in their hearts. Those who do not believe in God have made him a liar by not believing in the testimony that God has given concerning his Son. And this is the testimony: God gave us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life.
